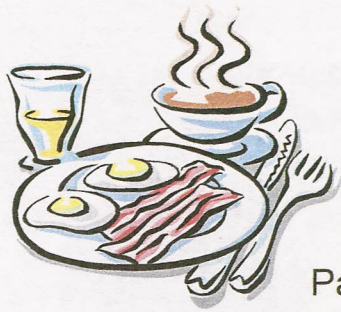


Guess Who for January?
