CHEF'S CORNER

Here is an easy and tasty casserole
good for serving anytime.

Hamburger-Corn Casserole (Serves 10)

Ingredients:

1-1/2 lbs ground beef

1 cup chopped onion

1-12 oz. Can whole kernel corn (drained)

1 can condensed chicken soup

1 can condensed mushroom soup

1 cup sour cream yas A as J & you list

3/4 tsp salt

1/2 teaspoon MSG (optional)

1/4 tsp pepper

3 cups noodles, cooked and drained

Lightly brown hamburger, add onions and cook until tender. Add remaining ingredients and mix well. Stir in 3 cups of cooled, drained noodles. Pour into a casserole dish. Sprinkle with bread crumbs and butter. Bake in moderate 350 Degree oven for 30 minutes.
