By Popular Demand, Sarah Lombard's Chicken Cashew Casserole.

- $\frac{1}{2}$ chopped onion
- $\frac{1}{2}$ diced celery
- 2 Tbsp. Butter or margarine
- 1 can cream/mushroom soup
- $\frac{1}{2}$ c chicken broth
- 1 Tbsp. Soy sauce
- Dash of black pepper
- 2 c. chicken, cooked/diced
- $\frac{1}{2}$ c. cashews
- 1 $\frac{1}{3}$ c. French Fr. Onions, divided

Combine onion, celery, and butter. Cook until tender. Add remaining ingred. except cashews and French's onions. Simmer 5 minutes and pour into casserole, add nuts and $\frac{2}{3}$ c. French's onions. Bake 350 degrees for 25 minutes. Top with remaining onions and bake 5 min. more. Serves 6
