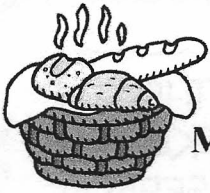

**Swiss  
Mushroom  
Chicken**

- 4 boneless skinless chicken breast halves
- 1 Egg
- ¾ Cup crushed butter-flavored crackers  
(about 25)
- ¾ tsp. Salt
- ½ lb. Fresh mushrooms sliced
- 2 T. butter or margarine, divided
- 4 slices of honey ham or salami
- 4 slices of baby swiss

Flatten chicken ¼ inch thickness. In a shallow bowl, lightly beat the egg. Combine cracker crumbs and salt in another shallow bowl. Dip chicken in egg, then crumbs; set aside. In a large ovenproof skillet, sauté mushrooms in half the butter; remove and set aside. In the same skillet, melt the remaining butter. Add chicken; cook over medium heat for 3 to 4 min. on each side or until juices run clear. Top each chicken breast with a ham slice folded in half, mushroom and a cheese slice. Broil 4 in. from heat for 1-2 minutes or until the cheese melts. Yield 4 servings. Good reheated also.

Last month we were thinking about faith and what was accomplished by it.

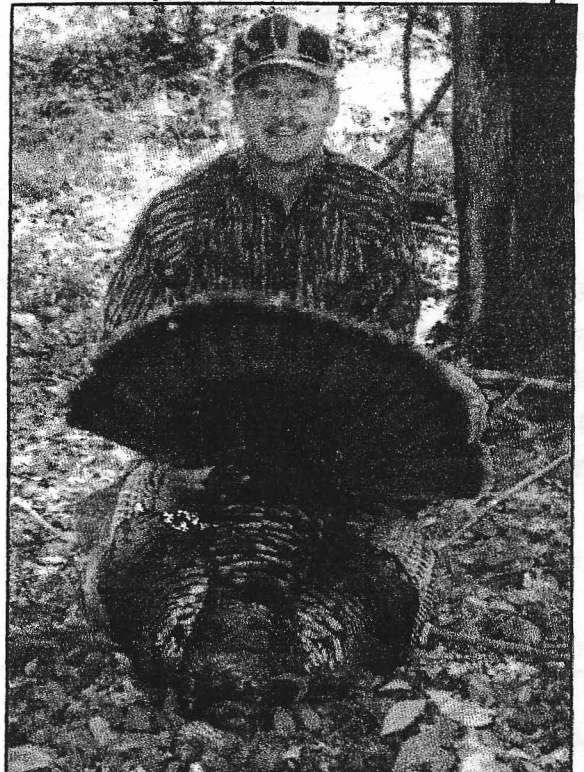

### **CRAFT DAY AT THE CLUBHOUSE**

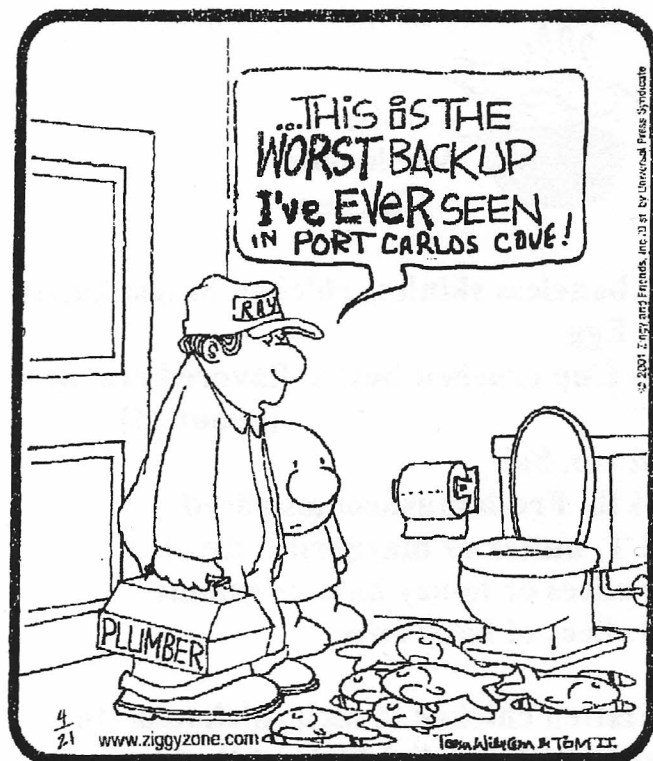
A lap quilt is being made to raffle at the
