#### Hurricane Disaster Response Practice

An imaginary hurricane will be coming ashore at Fort Myers Beach on Friday afternoon, October 2nd. This simulated disaster will bring out dozens of amateur (ham) radio operators on Friday and Saturday from Lee, Charlotte, Hendry, and Collier Counties to practice coordinated emergency radio response among each county's hospitals, emergency shelters, and Red Cross facilities, as well as Emergency Operations Center amateur radio rooms.

The radio operators are members of the Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES®), a public service organization sponsored by the American Radio Relay League, Its members are

The simulated disaster will begin the week with e-mail informational bulletins sent to the ARES® team members, with the faux storm hitting on Friday. On Saturday, October 3rd, team members will be deployed to shelters, hospitals and EOCs to test functional readiness and of both equipment and operators. During Saturday's simulated disaster response, operators will utilize their training to provide shortwave

Center amateur radio rooms of each county.


"Amateur radio, often called 
"ham radio", has consistently 
been the most reliable means of 
communications in emergencies 
when other systems failed or were 
overloaded," said Steve Smith, 
ARES® Emergency Coordinator 
in Lee County. "We enjoy a great 
working relationship with Lee 
County Emergency Management, 
fire and law enforcement agencies, 
and stand ready to support them as 
needed, 24/7."

The simulated disaster drill is in addition to required weekly radio communication practice and monthly training for ARES® volunteers.

# News Press - 11-15-93. Last Mobile home dwellers do it their way

Some 150 mobile home dwellers finally will be rid of the fear of a takeover of their Fort Myers Beach park when they sign on the dotted line today for a \$3-million deal to buy the 30-acre subdivision they call home.

"It's been like a Damocles sword hanging over our heads," William Martin, one of the residents, said Sunday. "That just won't be there any more."

Martin, an eight-year resident of San Carlos Cove, on Main Street, said a trend in Florida to "condo ize" mobile home parks has meant constant insecurity for those living in the parks.

"It's a day-to-day fear," he said of the possibility of his park being bought by a developer who might try to sell each lot for an exhort-itent price.

The average resident of San Carios Cove will pay about \$20,000 for the lot he now rents once the deal is completed, he said. The average monthly payments for San Carios Cove residents will drop by about one third, he added.

"There won't be any other owner to be making a profit now," he

The current deal, which should be finalized at 11 a.m. at the office of Fred Corey, a Fort Myer Beach aftorney, has been in the works slace
